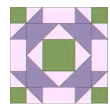
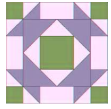

Minutes of the October 5, 2021, Shiner Heritage Quilter's Meeting

On October 5, 2021, President Janet Ferguson called the meeting to order and welcomed the members of the Shiner Heritage Quilters. There were 22 members and four visitors in attendance.

The Guild members recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Janet thanked the hostesses for the evening, Betty Maskey, Bernadette Kresta and Karin Filipp.

Janet presented the Meeting Minutes for the September 7th meeting and asked if there were any corrections and there were none. A motion to approve the August Meeting Minutes was made by Sherrie Holland and seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Rae Nell Janik read the September 2021 Treasurer's Report. There no changes made to the Treasurer's Report, and it was filed for audit.

Toni Rogers asked for Sunshine and Shadows and October birthdays were celebrated.

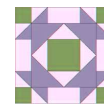
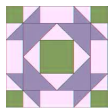
Irene Cerny brought the members up-to-date on the progress being made for the 2022 Quilt Show. Bernadette also distributed applications for entry of a quilt into the Show.

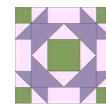
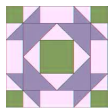

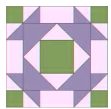
